Recognitions and Highlights

- Fox C-6 is fully accredited with distinction in performance by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
 - For the past 3 years, Fox C-6 has increased its Annual Performance Review (APR) scores by nearly 10%. The district's 2017 APR scores were at 98.9%, higher than all of its neighbors, including Lindbergh, Rockwood, Mehlville, and Windsor.
- Fox C-6 is a National District of Character with multiple buildings named National Schools of Character and has other distinctions like National Blue Ribbon and Missouri Gold Star.
- Fox C-6 staff have been named Milken Award winners, Emerson Excellence in Teaching winners, and regional Teachers of the Year.
- Fox C-6 students are some of the best in the nation, attending National Leadership Academy and other leadership programs as well as competing nationally in band, dance, golf, robotics, speech and debate, and more!
- The Fox C-6 community is made up of retirees, local organizations, parents, and stakeholders who continue to partner with the district to ensure the success of district students.

College Readiness

The greatest increase in Fox C-6 APR over recent years has been in College and Career Readiness. As a district, we pride ourselves in offering a wide variety of opportunities to students while encouraging rigor and grit.

District Highlights

The Fox C-6 School District was originally comprised of five one-room school houses, which were consolidated in 1948 to form the Fox Consolidated School District No. 6, or Fox C-6. Today, the district continues a long tradition of excellence with strong parent and community partnerships, growth in technology, and an emphasis on making sure every graduate is an expert in something they love to do.



The district is comprised of 11 elementary buildings, as well as an Early Childhood Center. Within several elementary buildings are additional Early Childhood classrooms. At the secondary level, there are 4 middle schools and 2 high schools, along with the Bridges Alternative School. Additionally, the district is home to several other facilities, including Rickman Auditorium and the Roy Wilde Conference Center both which play host to numerous district and community events. Enrollment throughout the district is approximately 11,586 students in pre-kindergarten through 12th grade.

To achieve its mission of creating lifelong learners, the District has designed a full range of programs to support student learning and achievement. Programs and instruction such as Parents As Teachers, full-day kindergarten, comprehensive special education services, gifted education classes, college-level classes for high school students, computer assisted instruction, effective classroom instruction in all academic areas, the fine arts, and physical education are designed to promote lifelong learning and pride in achievement.



Success in life also comes from having a strong moral foundation of principles on which to base learning. In addition to the educational development of our students, we also concern ourselves with developing their character. The District has received numerous recognitions for its character education programs and has been named a National District of Character - a distinction shared with many of the District's individual buildings that have also been recognized for their merit.

Community Highlights

Spanning approximately 75 square miles of suburban and rural landscapes, the Fox C-6 school district is the largest school district in Jefferson County, Missouri, servicing over 11,000 students. Located in the northeastern section of the county, the district lies along the border of St. Louis County and is close proximity to shopping, recreation, and natural settings.

As the second largest employer in the county, Fox C-6 prides itself on its community of parents and stakeholders who are active within the district's 11 elementary buildings, 4 middle schools, 2 high schools, alternative high school, and early childhood.
