Community Attributes

Maryville, population 10,633, is located about midway between Kansas City and Omaha. Its combination of small-town living, recreational opportunities, unique local businesses, and services make Maryville a wonderful place to live and raise a family.

Maryville's 3000-acre Mazingo Lake Park offers camping, hiking trails, golfing, boating, and fishing. Maryville Parks and Recreation maintains 10 additional parks, including an aquatic center, a skate park, and fields for baseball, softball, football, and soccer. Its community center houses a three-court gymnasium, rooms for weights, aerobics, spinning, and yoga, and offers classes and leagues for all ages, summer concerts, and a variety of holiday festivals. Maryville is home to Northwest Missouri State University, recognized nationally for quality education and national championship athletics. It offers diverse cultural programming through performances, concerts, and lectures. Its beautiful campus, the Missouri Arboretum, is surrounded by a public walking trail and home to an 18-hole disc golf course. Downtown Maryville offers eating establishments, entertainment venues, and shops for home goods, hardware, clothing, flowers, antiques, and more. Mosaic Medical Center offers both in and outpatient services, emergency room and specialty care. Multiple newspapers and radio stations are located in town to serve the region.

District Highlights

- Maryville R-II is fully accredited by DESE, a member of the Midland Empire Conference, and an A+ school. It serves over 1400 students and employs more than 200 people. The district free and reduced lunch rate is 37%, and 75% of graduates seek post-secondary education or training. The student to teacher ratio is 17:1, and 65% of staff have advanced degrees. Professional staff averages 12.5 years of experience.
- Elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as an early childhood center, the Northwest Technical School, and an alternative school are located in three distinct campuses. In the last five years, the district has built a 700-seat, state-of-the-art performing arts center, an auxiliary gymnasium, and a new central office building.
- All staff have been trained in the "Leader in Me" philosophy to promote a district-wide culture of leadership, character, and inclusion. A wide variety of sports and organizations are offered to appeal to diverse student interests. Students also have Project Lead the Way opportunities available in engineering, biomedical sciences, and computer technology.
- The district values community partnerships. Northwest Technical School houses the local office & classroom for Adult Basic Education and offers classes outside the traditional school day in areas such as personal enrichment, health, crafts, great outdoors, business,
