The Warsaw R-IX School District is fully accredited by the Missouri Department of Elementary & Secondary Education. It has approximately 1,300 students in grades PreK-12 with a staff of about 200 located throughout four buildings and across three campus locations.

There is a strong relationship between the school district and community, as evidenced by the dedicated parental involvement and support organizations. Each of the elementary buildings has an active parent-teacher organization, and booster clubs exist in the high school and middle school to support the athletic and music programs. In addition, recent bond issues have allowed the district to make significant improvements to the high school and both elementary schools.

Warsaw R-IX seeks to attract and retain the best, brightest, and most qualified employees available. A large percentage of the staff is tenured and has received a master's degree or higher. Student achievement is data-driven, and there are programs in place for the gifted and talented as well as the struggling learner. Warsaw is scenically located at the intersection of 65 and 7 highways and sits between the two largest lakes in Missouri: Lake of the Ozarks and Truman Lake. It is home to the Harry S. Truman Dam and Reservoir. This quaint, yet progressive, riverfront town has a rich history and heritage. Hunting, fishing, boating, and camping top the list of favored outdoor activities. Drake Harbor has a host of riverfront trails that are perfect for everyone whether you are out for a relaxing stroll, bicycle ride or if you are a serious walker or runner. The City of Warsaw has walking trails and biking trails for the community.

Visitors can also enjoy the numerous antique shops that are available for their convenience.

Each year, the Warsaw community has visitors come during the summer to experience Jubilee Days, which offers family fun, carnival rides, contests, crafters, and a Main Street parade. In the fall, visitors return to celebrate old-time demonstrations from the 1800's during the Heritage Days Festival.

Although tourism is Warsaw's main business, it is a well-rounded community. The Warsaw Municipal Airport with its 3,300-foot runway is located on Highway 65. The state-of-the-art Lost Valley Fish Hatchery is located just north of town and is operated by the Missouri State Conservation Commission. Lay Park is the center of the Warsaw Park system, and it has a wonderful view of the waterfront.

Warsaw is also the home to several industries located throughout the city. With numerous business districts located throughout the town, Warsaw offers a great location to live and work.
