Community Attributes

The town of Stewartsville is in the southwest corner of DeKalb County. It is 16 miles from Cameron and 15 miles from St. Joseph located off Highway 36. Stewartsville is comprised of 752 residents and is named after Robert Marcellus Stewart, who was the 14th governor of Missouri from 1857-1861. As governor, Robert Stewart championed the founding of the Hannibal and St. Joseph Railroad, which led to the creation of the Pony Express.

For 26 years a four-classroom frame building was used as a school building until 1914 when a new building was opened. In 1935 a gym addition was added to the building. The building since has gone through several transformations including additions for a new kitchen, elementary rooms, and a nurse and counselor's office. In 1976 an addition was added for a school office and gym, and lastly, in 1995 a new Science Room, Library and Technology Department were added.

In 2008 the building was retrofitted with cost-saving lighting, heating, and air conditioning. A bond was passed in 2010, which allowed renovation of much of the district's buildings and facilities.

In August, the town hosts a Fall Festival that is known for its famous "festival burgers."
